Is a volcano a mountain?

Yes, a volcano is a mountain. It has an opening at the top and at the bottom. At the bottom it opens to a pool of molten rock that stays under the surface of the Earth.

How are they formed?

They are formed when the magma from below the Earth makes it way to the surface. When it gets to the top, it erupts and throws lava from the top of the volcano.

Why does the magma move?

The dormant ones are the ones that have not erupted for some time but might still erupt one day. The extinct ones are the ones that will never erupt again.

Are there many volcanoes in the world?

There are more than 1500 active volcanoes in the word. There are some volcanoes under the sea too.

Which are the most famous eruptions?

I will name two famous eruptions: one is a volcano called Mount Etna, in Sicily, Italy. About 20.000,00 people were killed by its eruption in 1669. The volcano Vesuvius is the most famous eruption. Also in Italy, it destroyed the towns of Pompeii and Stabiae.
